4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT PROVIDING THAT A PERSON WHO WILL BE HOUSED IN A JAIL
5 OR CORRECTIONAL FACILITY FOR MORE THAN 12 HOURS MAY BE SUBJECT TO A STRIP SEARCH;
6 PROVIDING FOR A FEE; AND AMENDING SECTION 46-5-105, MCA."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

10 **Section 1.** Section 46-5-105, MCA, is amended to read:

11 **"46-5-105. Reasonable suspicion required before strip search -- exception -- FEE.** (1) A-Except as
12 provided in subsection (2), a person arrested or detained for a traffic offense or an offense that is not a felony
13 may not be subjected to a strip search or a body cavity search by a peace officer or law enforcement employee
14 unless there is reasonable suspicion to believe the person is concealing a weapon, contraband, or evidence of
15 the commission of a crime.

16 (2) If a person will be housed in a jail or correctional facility FOLLOWING AN INITIAL APPEARANCE OR
17 ARRAIGNMENT for more than 12 hours, the person may be subjected to a strip search. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS
18 SUBSECTION, THE STRIP SEARCH CONDUCTED BY A PEACE OFFICER OR LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEE MAY NOT
19 INCLUDE PENETRATION OF ANY BODY CAVITY. THE STRIP SEARCH OF THE PERSON MUST BE CONDUCTED BY A PEACE
20 OFFICER OR LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEE OF THE SAME SEX.

21 (3) EACH COUNTY IN THE STATE OF MONTANA SHALL PAY A \$250 FEE TO THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE
22 TO ASSIST IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF GUIDELINES FOR CONDUCTING STRIP SEARCHES."
